

46 Acceptance of funds shall be in accordance with the school's practice and policy on
47 donations, gifts, grants and bequests as later outlined in this policy. The Principal/Tech
48 Director/Superintendent/Board retains the right to accept or refuse any donation, gifts,
49 grants, or bequests.

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51 **Requested Information:** The Superintendent/Designee will develop a procedure for
52 submitting fundraising requests. Such information required for requests includes: name
53 of the project, purpose, method to raise funds, and the individuals involved and their
54 contact information.

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56 This fundraising policy applies to all faculty, staff, and students within the Franklin
57 Central Supervisory Union and its member schools.

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59 **Donations, Gifts, Grants, and Bequests:** Donations, gifts, non-school initiated grants,
60 or bequests made to Franklin Central Supervisory Union and/or its member schools with
61 a value of \$1,000 or greater may be accepted only by the appropriate Board.

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63 Donations, gifts, non-school initiated grants, or bequests made to Franklin Central
64 Supervisory Union and/or its member schools with a value greater than \$49.00 and up to
65 \$1,000 may be accepted by the Superintendent/Principal/Tech Director.

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67 Donations, gifts, non-school initiated grants, or bequests made to Franklin Central
68 Supervisory Union and/or its member schools with a value less than \$49.00 may be
69 accepted by an employee of the school.

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71 In all cases, approval of such donations, gifts, grants, or bequests shall be considered if in
72 compliance with the following criteria:

- 73 1. Acceptance of the donation, gift, non-school initiated grant, or bequest is not in
74 conflict with provisions of public law or school policies.
- 75 2. Acceptance of the donation, gift, non-school initiated grant, or bequest does not
76 require or imply the endorsement of any business or commercial product.
- 77 3. Acceptance of the donation, gift, non-school initiated grant, or bequest does not
78 require Board commitment of District or Supervisory Union funds, except when
79 the Board would choose to expend those funds for the same purposes for which
80 the donation, gift, grant, or bequest is offered.
- 81 4. Acceptance of the donation, gift, non-school initiated grant, or bequest is judged
82 to be in the best interests of providing quality education for the pupils of the
83 District.

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85 The Board may waive any or all of the above criteria should it be deemed necessary and
86 appropriate.

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88 The Board and its designees reserve the right to decline any donation, gift, non-school
89 initiated grant, or bequest which, in the opinion of the Board, places or carries either a
90 restriction or an obligation that is considered to be inappropriate or not in the best
91 interests of the School District.

92 All donations, gifts, non-school initiated grants, or bequests to the school or the school
93 district shall become the property of the school district.

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95 **Public Solicitations and Advertising in Schools:** Franklin Central Supervisory Union
96 and its member schools discourage and restrict solicitation of students and staff on school
97 premises for commercial and/or political purposes.

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99 Approval of the Principal/Tech Director is needed:

- 100 1. to post bulletins announcing services to staff and students;
101 2. to distribute commercial or political materials;
102 3. for all fundraising activities;
103 4. for sales or solicitation on the school premises;
104 5. for distribution of any informational materials not related directly to the
105 instructional program.

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107 The Superintendent in consultation with the Principal/Tech Director/Designee will
108 develop procedures that will guide the decision-making process.
